There are 3 types of training series that you can choose to schedule at your location *free of charge:*

- 1. PITC Series: 5 classes at 3 hours each on Program for Infant Toddler Care Relationship-based care practices
- 2. Birth To Three Series: 6 classes at 2 hours each on each of the 5 Domains of Development
- 3. Health & Safety Series: 4 classes at 2 hours each on Tummy Time, Outdoor play, Moving and Learning, & Mealtimes
- 4. **Inclusive Care Series:** In each 2-hour class in this 4-part series, we will address all you need to feel comfortable helping families identify and include infants and toddlers with special needs in your care.

Effective October 1, 2016 all child care PROVIDERS must be ELIGIBLE to receive child care subsidies.

PROVIDER ELIGIBILITY requires at least 10 hours of DFD Approved Health & Safety Training as well as Pediatric First Aid & CPR Training. These trainings are available online at no or low cost at www.njccis.com and www.childcarenj.com or in person through Child & Family Resources and all other Child Care Resource and Referral organizations in New Jersey.
