

There are <u>3 types of training series</u> that you can choose to schedule at your location *free of charge:* 

1. PITC Series: 5 classes at 3 hours each on Program for Infant Toddler Care Relationship-based care practices

2. Birth To Three Series: 6 classes at 2 hours each on each of the 5 Domains of Development

3. Health & Safety Series: 4 classes at 2 hours each on Tummy Time, Outdoor play, Moving and Learning, & Mealtimes 4. Inclusive Care Series: In each 2-hour class in this 4-part series, we will address all you need to feel comfortable helping families identify and include infants and toddlers with special needs in your care.

Effective October 1, 2016 all child care PROVIDERS <u>must be ELIGIBLE</u> to receive child care subsidies. *PROVIDER ELIGIBILITY requires at least 10 hours of DFD Approved Health & Safety Training as well as Pediatric First Aid & CPR Training. Pediatric Residency Program: Providing Community Child Care Health Education: Goryeb Children's Hospital Atlantic Health and Pediatric & Adolescent Health Education Programs in collaboration with Child & Family Resources. Through this collaboration Pediatric Residents are available to child care providers and the children and families in their care. Community Child Care Health Education promotes healthy and safe environments, provides health and safety information, encourages preventive health care for all children in child care.

On-site visits are pre-arranged and require advance notification. Visits typically last about one hour. What to expect during an on-site Pediatric Resident Visit: *Classroom Observation, Health & Safety Education, Program for teacher & children (A 10–15 minute developmentally and age appropriate activity presented by the Pediatric Resident, Exit briefing and Technical Assistance with program Director.* Contact Charlene O'Brien at (973) 770-5822 to schedule a visit or for more information about available workshop topics.
